



## Cimalegna Geologic-Pedologic field trip

A hike on Monte Rosa to learn about the geological history of tha Alps and the characteristic of high-elevation soils





Cimalegna plateau is reached by the Monterosaski cableways: a cable car from Alagna, Valsesia, and a cable car from Gressoney La Trinitè, Lys Valley, link the villages to Passo dei Salati at 2980 m altitude.

## Alagna - From Passo dei Salati to Col d'Olen

Along the Cimalegna Plateau alt. 2900 m

Cimalegna is a glacial plateau with a triangular shape that from the border ridge between Piemonte and Valle d'Aosta (at abaout 3000 m of altitude) gently slpopes down toward Valsesia, down to 2600 m, above the Bocchetta delle Pisse. To the north, Cimalegna is limited by Conca delle Pisse (Bors glacier) and, to the south, by Vallone d'Olen.

The watershed ridge extends from Stolenberg 3202 m to Passo dei Salati 2946, Corno del Camoscio 3024 m, Col d'Olen 2881 m and Corno Rosso 3022 m.

Cimalegna is a perfect place to examine the geological history of the north-western Alps, with particular regard to the last 200 million years geodynamic evolution. The natural environment is interesting also from a pedological point of view, allowing the recognition of soils that formed from their parent rocks in a subhorizontal zone, at high elevation and under extreme climatic conditions.

The Geologic-Pedologic field trip is a loop route along which 8 panels briefly describe the geological history of this sector of the alpine chain, main rocks and related soils.

It begins at Salati Pass (2936 m), gently discends southward to the Scientific Institute Angelo Mosso, near the Lake Bowditch, and the area of Rifugio Vigevano, then reaches the Col d'Olen (2881 m), goes up the southern slope of Corno Camoscio, to its summit (3024 m), which offers a 360° panorama of the Monte Rosa massif, the Gressoney and Sesia valley and then goes down toward north, back to Passo dei Salati.


